

STUDENT / ADULT MEAL (NO CHARGE) POLICY

Pendleton County School District is participating in the Community Eligibility Provision District Wide starting with the 2018 – 2019 School Year.

This provision allows every student in Pendleton County School System to receive **(1) REIMBURSABLE** Breakfast and **(1) REIMBURSABLE** Lunch daily at no charge to the student.

Adult: Breakfast (\$2.50) & Lunch (\$3.75)

- At no time, will anyone be allowed to charge
- Students must have money in hand or money in their account in order to purchase extra items.
- Students, Adults, Staff, and Teachers are encouraged to pay in advance for Meals, Ala Cart items and any extra items purchased, but can also pay at time of purchase

The FOOD SERVICE tab allows parents and students access to the following food service information:

*Current account balances: ***Transactions** (food item purchases, account deposits of cash, check and credit card, when enabled)

* **Account history** (historical transaction records): * **Account adjustments** (debits/credits)
